InfoAge Diana Site Mission Statement 2004**

The Ocean-Monmouth Amateur Radio Club Inc. (OMARC) is proud to be a member of the InfoAge Learning Center and to have a point of presence at the Diana site.

The OMARC mission in conjunction with InfoAge is threefold:

1. OMARC will educate the visiting public about the Amateur Radio Service and provide a means for those persons interested, to obtain Amateur Radio license training and license testing opportunities toward obtaining an FCC required, Amateur Radio license.
2. OMARC will provide a fully functional Amateur Radio station and electronic test laboratory in support of those persons interested in learning and applying radio theory and proper on-the-air operational techniques. In addition, OMARC will provide support to U.S. Army MARS and local Township, County and State Offices of Emergency Management (OEM) in support of Homeland Defense, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and other MARS and OEM agencies served.
3. OMARC will educate the visiting public regarding the historical significance of the Diana site as it relates to both the "WWII Radar" developments, "Project Diana" Moon Bounce experiment's and "Guglielmo Marconi" dating back to the 1912-1914 era.

To this end;

1. OMARC will provide to the public at no cost, Amateur Radio literature and maintain a technical library, provide Amateur Radio classes and regularly scheduled walk-in license testing through the ARRL Volunteer Examiner (VE) program (a required FCC license fee is charged).
2. OMARC will maintain an Amateur Radio/MARS station on site capable of worldwide communications and an electronic test laboratory. OMARC has applied for and been granted a U.S. Army MARS Club station (AAR2CAB) license and has implemented a formal Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Monmouth County ARES RACES (MCARS) for the use of the OMARC Repeater Station for Emergency Communications.
3. OMARC will provide an InfoAge website computer terminal and provide literature, exhibit pictures and displays about "Project Diana" and the "Marconi Radio Company" as they become available for review by visitors to the Diana site.

Be it resolved, OMARC will do its best to be an asset to the InfoAge Learning Center and fulfill this mission statement to the best of its membership's ability.
